

# Veterans Build November 2025

November 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Kick-Off

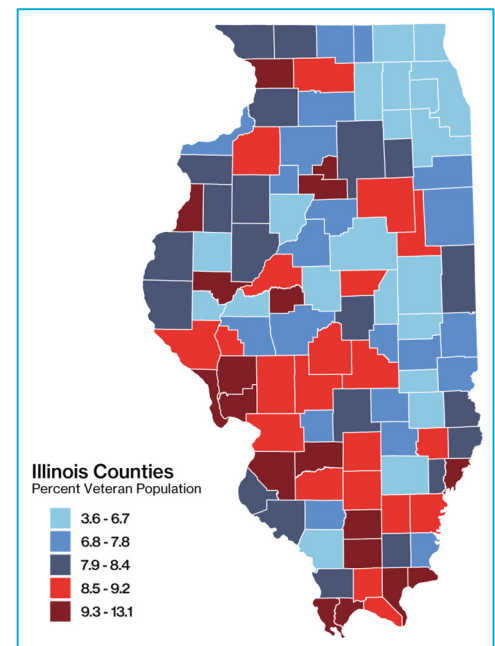


Habitat for Humanity was founded with the belief that everyone deserves a simple, decent place to call home. But we know that a home is more than a roof, walls and a door. Instead, we see a Habitat home as a foundation for a better, more stable future for homeowners and their families. By offering an affordable mortgage payment, and a literal and metaphorical foundation for our partner families, Habitat for Humanity provides the stability that families need to thrive.

## Veteran-Specific Housing Needs

In 2013, Habitat for Humanity launched the Veteran Build program to ensure that the men and women who have served our country could experience safe and stable housing. While the VA reports that veteran households overall have higher employment rates and median incomes than non-veterans, many still face housing problems.

- Approximately 79% of veterans are homeowners, yet many still face significant barriers to affordable housing.
- While the percentage of veteran households experiencing moderate housing cost burden has decreased from 25% to 20%, a notable number still spend over 30% of their income on housing.
- Female veterans are more likely to experience housing instability compared to their male counterparts, a growing concern as the female veteran population is projected to increase in the coming years.
- Post-9/11 veterans face a higher likelihood of severe housing cost burden compared to nonveterans, often encountering greater challenges in affording rental costs and achieving stable housing.



To be considered affordable, the US Department of Housing and Urban Development affirms that no more than 30% of household income must be spent on housing expenses. Otherwise, families must often choose between paying rent, and paying for other needs – such as food, heat or medicine.

## Chicagoland Habitat's Veteran Build Initiative

Following the model of Habitat for Humanity's National Veteran Build movement, Chicagoland Habitat's Veteran Build Initiative empowers local military and veteran families to achieve the strength, stability and self-reliance that stable homeownership provides, with the following objectives:

- Building new and repairing existing homes for veterans
- Offering financial education to support successful homeownership among veteran homeowners

- Recruiting military veterans to work with Habitat as employees, board members, and volunteers
- Providing volunteer experiences that can bring together veterans and military families with their neighbors, easing the transition to civilian life with fulfilling community engagement
- Hosting special events that pay tribute to veterans, raise awareness and mobilize volunteers
